



The Only Place Success Comes before Work is in the Dictionary.

It is not too common we see a business get passed from one generation to another. It is amazing the family has been able to make it this far. But to continue a tradition is something to celebrate. Such is the case we heard last week when Brownie Simpson of Kansas City Catering announced to the Club some wonderful news. His son-in-law Chris Freeman will transition this summer into Brownie's position as president / owner of the company. Brownie says he will stay on in an advisory level position and will continue to assist in coordinating events as needed.

Chris was introduced early in the presentation as we learned how he got to where he is now. Chris has known Brownie's daughter for quite a while, and they had been dating what seemed like forever. So he could be close to her, Brownie hired Chris to assist in doing whatever was needed at his many different events. When Chris had spare time, you could always find him ready to step in where needed.

After graduating from college, Chris began working in sales for Xerox Corporation, and did that for several years. He was doing well, but like some starting out, was not happy with what he was doing. So he approached Brownie and asked if he needed anyone in his sales department. Brownie had many chances to talk to Chris since he ended up marrying his daughter. Chris told him someday he hoped to own a business of his own. Seems Brownie had bigger plans in mind.

Chris was hired on to help in operations learning the day-to-day ways things worked. How events are scheduled, making sure all the equipment is available for putting on the event, and having the staff to make it all happen. After a year or so, Brownie said you're now ready for..... learning what happens in the kitchen. Chris spent the next 2-3 years with some of the best chefs in Kansas City. They inspired him to come up with menu ideas of his own, and they taught him all that is needed to happen to make each event unique for that client. No deal was left unturned. It was then he was promoted to sales where he has been since.

When Brownie started he did lots of small to medium sized events, but he knew the pot of gold was in corporate business events. He was very fortunate when he got a lead and became the caterer for the Kansas City Convention Center and Bartle Hall. It was not until 2005 when KC Catering faced their biggest challenge – when Sam Walton's Sam's Club brought their national convention to KC. And Brownie got the bid for it. Not the cheapest, but for sure the best. But how to handle this massive event? They had 20 buffets working at once, two lunch sessions of 4500 early and 3000 late. And their day got started at the crack of dawn so they had to have breakfasts ready for them EARLY!

So what has worked in this family business? There is a lot of give and take. And lots of open communication. Working with family can be stressful, but having the ability to voice your opinions and also to be able to do this without repercussions for saying what you think. The staff has shown its loyalty (chef – 10 years; operations manager 36 years there). And they have the ability to shrink and grow as needed depending on the jobs they take on. They can do a small group using 8 staff up to 3500 to handle the huge convention business.

What sounded so unique is lots of the parttime staff they hire to help have been with them for many years, so when they hear of a company looking for someone to do an event, they refer KC Catering to them. They get a chance to bid on their business. They don't get them all, but at least a majority they do. Chris is now doing what Brownie used to do – spending his time cultivating big business. This transition comes at a time when most of Brownie's clients have become ill or passed away. It is time for the younger generation to take over.

They try not to work their staff more than 40 hours a week, and offer them profit sharing which is unheard of in the catering business. They try to make it fun and fair at the same time. But they always try to make them know how much they appreciate what they do to make the company such a success.
